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Arizona Masters' National Team poses between events at the 2007 Short Course Nationals in May.

Thirty-six swimmers traveled to Federal Way, Washington to represent Arizona Masters in the 2007 Short Course Nationals, May 17-20. Two beautiful indoor competition pools provided spectators non-stop action as champions set National Records in 70 individual events and 11 relays.

Among the record-setters was Jeff Commings of Tucson. Swimming under the University of San Francisco banner, Jeff established new standards in the Men's 30-34 50-yard Breast (25.78) and 100-yard Breast (55.85). He rounded out his meet with two more golds in the 100 Back and 100 I.M., a silver in 100 Fly and a bronze in 100 Free.

Aside from medals and records, personal best times were recorded by many Arizona swimmers. At Nationals, each swimmer may enter up to six individual events (three without qualifying times). Of 142 teams, Arizona came in 5th in combined Men's and Women's points.

Special thanks go to Relay Meister Jim Stites of Ford Aquatics Masters, for putting swimmers together for some fast team swimming, and to Simon Percy, Arizona's National Team Coach, who video-taped as many of our swimmers' events as he could for posterity.

United States Masters Swimming holds two national championship meets each year. The short-course yards championship is held in the late spring, usually in April or May. The long-course championship is held in August (coming up August 10-13 at The Woodlands Aquatic Center, Woodlands, TX.) FINA sponsors the Masters world championship long course meet every other year (coming up next in Perth, Australia April 15-25 2008). Going to Extreme Lengths to Prevent Drowning

Kathleen Lawrence, seen here with 10-year old Allie Jones of Phoenix, is an Arizona Masters Swimmer and open water enthusiast who swam for her first time from Alcatraz to San Francisco's Aquatic Park on April 25, 2007. It wasn't just a lark. Her swim was part of a team effort to bring attention to the importance of drowning prevention.



Kathleen and Allie were part of the Swim Neptune/ Team Alcatraz Swim. Of a total of 50 youngsters (age 8 to 17) and 50 adult distance swimmers, all but one made the crossing. An 8-year-old girl, Emma Schlenker of Phoenix, took the world record for youngest girl to swim this crossing. Emma said later on the "Ellen" show that she did this to help prevent kids from drowning this summer.

Kathleen told Swim Arizona "Out here in the senior communities, we don't have life guards at our pools. Many of us have our grandchildren over the summer months. If my swim from Alcatraz can bring drowning prevention awareness to seniors, it was well worth every wave, every mouthful of salt water!"

Kathleen reports that during the swim, the water temp was 52 degrees, with wind chop, waves and strong currents. The group completed the 1.5 mile swim in 1 hour 2 minutes. Swim Neptune is the team young Braxton Bilbrey, of Glendale, AZ, swims with. You may recall Braxton was the youngest person to swim from Alcatraz, at age 7, in May 2006. Braxton inspired the F.A.S.T. Foundation: Foundation for Aquatic Safety and Training. The F.A.S.T. Foundation, based in Scottsdale, helps kids learn to swim, supplies locks for pool fences, pool fences, supports families with children who have brain damage due to "near drownings" and many other community programs to help save kids around water.

Kathleen serves as Team Swim Neptune's Honorary Grandmother. This summer, Swim Neptune is bringing awareness to the Senior communities in the Phoenix area by having "Grandparent's Water Safety Days." During these events, the Neptune kids and Sun City Starrs swim demos, the Aqua Suns Synchro swimmers put on a show, adult swim and private swim lessons are offered, the Sun City Fire Dept does a CPR demonstration and F.A.S.T. Foundation distributes information about drowning prevention.

Kathleen has been a USMS swimmer for the past six years. A former marathon runner and triathlete, at 63 Kathleen's new motto is: Have new hip....will swim! She swims with the Sun City Starrs, coached by John Jorgensen.

"We have an amazing Master's Team," says Kathleen. "Many are in the US Top Ten. Some are gold medal triathletes. Our Tom Taylor took second at Worlds in the 200 free. I am their long distance swimmer. I swim two to six miles, anywhere I can...Sea of Cortez, Bahamas, Pacific Ocean, any cold lake I can find."

Don't stop looking, Kathleen. We'll see you out there.
