### World's First All-glass Undersea Restaurant

On April 15th the first ever all-glass undersea restaurant in the world opened its doors for business at the Hilton Maldives Resort & Spa. Ithaa sits five meters below the waves of the Indian Ocean, surrounded by a vibrant coral reef and encased in clear acrylic offering diners 270-degrees of panoramic underwater views.

"We have used aquarium technology to put diners face-to-face with the stunning underwater environment of the Maldives", says Carsten Schieck, General Manager of Hilton Maldives Resort & Spa. "Our guests always comment on being blown away by the colour, clarity, and beauty of the underwater world in the Maldives, so it seemed the perfect idea to build a restaurant where diners can experience fine cuisine and take time to enjoy the views - without ever getting their feet wet."

This innovative restaurant is the first of its kind in the world, and is part of a US \$25 million re-build of Rangalifinolhu Island, one of the twin islands that make up Hilton Maldives Resort & Spa. This re-build includes the construction of 79 of the most luxurious Beach Villas in the country as well as the Spa Village, a self-contained, over-water 'resort-within-a-resort' consisting of a spa, restaurant and 21 villas. Staying at the resort will set you back \$1,000 per night or more.

The Maldives, located 400 miles southwest of Sri Lanka, were badly hit by the Asian tsunami of December 26, 2004, which killed 82 and caused substantial damage to Maldives tourism, housing, and fishing infrastructure. Hmm, anybody up for undersea dining?

I am 67 years old. Golf used to be fun but I do love the swimming. It is a challenge!!!!!!

Carol says she had no desire to swim until she read an article in the Sun City newspaper, written by Bev Linnihan, a master swimmer. According to Carol, Bev wrote a beautiful article on the benefits of swimming and the friendships surrounding the swim club. Carol was very impressed with the article and put it aside. Later, when Carol was rehabilitating from knee surgery, she remembered Bev's article, and signed up to take lessons with the Sun City swim club.

"My 'bad' knee really started to improve, as I practiced daily," said Carol. "Then my swim teacher urged me to practice with the Starrs Masters Swim Club in Sun City." Coach John Jorgensen watched Carol swim and encouraged her to 'try it out.'

Carol figured John was just being nice. In her words, she had "technique issues." Plus, she already had too many commitments. Nevertheless, she started to show up at 7 every morning, Monday thru Friday. Carol worked out in the "slow lane" and kept it up. Practice, practice, practice. Laps, laps, laps. She says she looks forward to graduating to another lane one of these days. For now, her goal is to drop a second off her freestyle time.

"What is so great about the Starrs Swim Club," Carol says, "is that they are a great swim 'family.' Everyone on the team is my cheerleader. ### Well Wishes for 'RonJon'

Our own Arizona Masters swimmer and multi-champion Ron Johnson is making an heroic recovery from a major cardiac crisis he suffered on March 31, 2007. In the Phoenix pool where AZ SCY Masters State Championships were taking place, Ron had just set a new national record in the 200-yard breaststroke for men 75-79 (3:07). Ron's heart difficulties hit him as he cooled down after the race; fortunately a number of other swimmers were on hand to come to Ron's aid almost immediately.

Ron was successfully transferred to the Arizona Heart Hospital by emergency teams. Later that afternoon physicians performed quadruple bypass surgery on our hero RonJon, and the next morning he appeared to be through the worst. Ron's daughter, Marika, kept friends informed by e-mail of Ron's steady recovery in hospital, and of his eventual return home "to do what the docs and his family tell him to do!"

Ron, we all send you our enthusiastic good wishes for your continued steady recovery. Cheers, from your fellow Arizona Masters Swimmers and swim fans everywhere.
